Dear Parents,

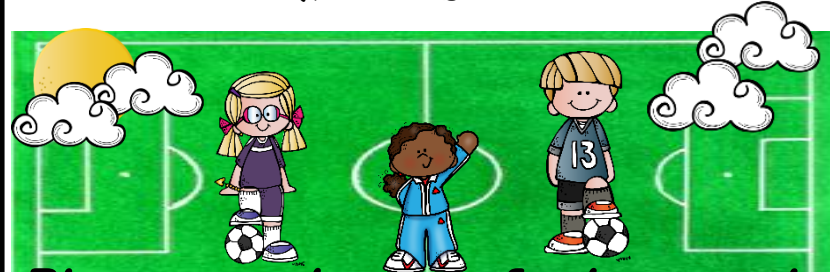
